Bristol Temple Meads

We need to remove all cycle storage from the platforms:

- to make room for scaffolding being installed for our roof renovations this autumn
- to ensure passengers can safely move around the station while the roof renovations are taking place
- to meet security legislation.

Bike storage will be removed from the station platforms permanently.



Cycle racks close 6 September 2020

We need to remove bike racks from platforms for renovations and security. Please reclaim your bike before **Sunday 6 September**.

On that date we will remove bikes without further warning and keep them safely elsewhere until Friday 6 November.

Rest assured bike parking on Station Approach will remain and we're building new storage at Temple Quay.

Cycle racks will close on Sunday 6 September.

We're asking anyone with a bike on the platform to collect it before that date.

We will move any left behind to a secure location elsewhere.

If your bike is among those moved, please speak to a member of station staff before 6 November. They will help get you reunited.

After 6 November any unclaimed bikes will be given to charity.



Where can you park your bike?

All existing cycle parking on Station Approach will remain.

We are also building a new temporary cycle storage facility on Friary at Temple Quay, just to the right of the ramped exit from the long stay car park.


This facility will hold more than 450 bikes. It will be covered, lit and protected by CCTV.

It will remain in place for the duration of the roof refurbishment project (until 2023) when the permanent location will be agreed.

New cycle parking from 5 September

Take the station's side entrance, head down the ramp and pass through the car park.

From 5 September your new bike storage will be just on the right, on Friary.

Cycle racks close 6 September 2020

We need to remove cycle racks from platforms 3 & 4 for renovations and security.


Please reclaim your bike and lock before Sunday 6 September.

On that date we'll have to move any remaining bikes to a secure location elsewhere and will hold them until Friday 6 November.

Your new cycle parking from 5 September



Take the station's side entrance, head down the ramp and pass through the car park.

From 5 September your new bike storage will be just on the right, on Friary.

Holding more than 450 bikes it will be covered, lit and protected by CCTV.

As a reminder, we'll be attaching tags to bikes that seem to be infrequently used and we think may have been abandoned – particularly as we approach 6 September.

We will use easy release ties so that owners are made aware but not held up or inconvenienced by the tags. These will not cause any damage.



Cycle storage closed

Sorry but we had to remove all bike parking from inside the station for renovations and for security reasons.

Don't panic - if you left your bike or lock here. We should have it safely tucked away elsewhere.

Summary

Passengers need to have removed their bikes from the station platform by Sunday 6 September.

From that date any bikes left will be moved to a secure location and you'll need to talk to a member of station staff to get it back.

After 6 November any unclaimed bikes will be given to charity.
